Lions District 2-E-2 Core 4 Grant Application

Based upon 2015-16 data with District 2-E-2 there are 41+ independent school districts which serve approximately 519,046 + students. The largest district is Fort Worth's 125,309; followed by Arlington's 64,484; Lewisville's 53,357; and Frisco's 49,644. In addition to these large school districts, the student populations in other school districts vary from 753 to 23,000.

Not calculating counselors, special education professionals, and administrators in acquiring the following estimate, there are approximately 20,529 school teachers within Lions District 2-E-2. To acquire the approximate number of teachers in Lions District 2-E-2 is based on the following student to teacher class ratio enrollments: Early Childhood 14 to 1; Pre-K 16 to 1; Kindergarten 16 to 1; First, Second and Third 23 to 1; Fourth through Eighth 28 to 1; and Ninth through Twelfth 29 to 1.

According to the 2015 data from the National Center for Children in Poverty, Texas has 25% of all children classified as Poor (yearly income below \$24,036 for a family of four). The percentage of children who are classified as Low-Income (yearly income for a family of four is below \$48,072) is 49%. When the Texas percentages of Poor and Low-Income are combined, 74% of Texas children are living in financially challenging conditions.

In the state of Texas schools are designated 6A-1A status based upon the population of the school. This system provides a way in which the state can compare academic state test results; assign academic, athletic, fine arts competition, disciplinary actions, and graduation rates. See below:

Goals:

Organize and conduct 3-one day trainings with two being for Pre-K-6 elementary in 2 school districts and the middle and high school will take place in another district. The middle and high schools are located in Castleberry ISD, and the elementary schools will probably be located in Sherman ISD and Gainesville ISD. The number of elementary teachers and administrators trained will be approximately 387, the middle 57, and the high school 67 with the number of professionals being trained 511. These teachers and administrators will touch the lives of approximately 5258 students per year.

Action Steps and Strategies:

As a Texas professional educator experienced as a past teacher of students 3 years of age through 12th grade; 5-A high school assistant principal, middle school principal, assistant superintendent of learning and accountability; adjunct professor of curriculum/instruction and educational leadership; as well as being the Immediate Past President of the Colleyville Lions Club, the 2-e2 Lions Quest Chair and the Texas Lions Quest Chair arranges an appointment with the superintendent and/or with his/her designee. During this meeting the Lions Quest attributes are presented while at the same time the professional educator is analyzing the:

- Genuine commitment of the superintendent and designees to the vital need to educate the Whole Child.
- Interest level, body language and their ideas as to how the Lions Quest curriculum could or will be provided to the children within their school district.
- By gaining the high interest in moving forward with Lions Quest, a meeting would be arranged with the principal/s of each school mentioned as a possibility. The same analysis process would be utilized regarding the principal's commitment, leadership skills, high expectations, goal focus, and willingness to monitor and insure that the Lion Quest teacher formats are being effectively and successfully utilized in order for the students to practice and understand the skills and traits well enough to become "habits."
- If possible, meet the teachers expected to execute the curriculum while looking for open-mindedness, enthusiasm, and willingness to go the extra "mile."
- During all of these meetings the professional educator representative will pay close attention to what IS NOT BEING SAID.
- Acquire the school district's commitment to furnish the prior year's data and provide the student quantitative and qualitative data for at least the first year of teaching Lions Quest, and when possible the second year.

• Follow-up communication will be very important. Keeping that personal contact insures the school is valued and help is at hand when a "challenge" emerges.

At the same time as Lions District 2-E-2 Chairperson of Lions Quest I make presentations to the clubs throughout the district. Lions' awareness, excitement and support have greatly increased over the past two years. These leading citizens can verbally share with their neighbors, church members, etc. the positive attributes of Lions Quest.

- (1) Workshop logistics includes meals (2 breakfasts/2lunches/2breaks) and refreshments for 3 one-day workshops for a total of 511 participants in three school districts.
- (2) Workshop materials include one curriculum (\$150 per person) which includes a copy of the student journal.
- (3) Trainer fee for a1-day training is \$2,700 for no more than 40 educators. The total trainings needed will require 14 trainers.
- (4) The gathering of quantitative data primarily consist of statistics regarding the Lions Quest pre-test/post-test results. Additional data may consist of a combination of student attendance, improvement in academics, teacher attendance, disciplinary actions, and parent/community involvement. Qualitative data consist of student/teacher/parent interviews, classroom and school visits/observations and/or antidotal data.
- (5) Administrative cost represents 9.1% of the total project cost which consist of supplies, travel expenses, bookkeeping, support services conducted by other identities, equipment if needed, etc.
- (6) Cost of 5 Steering Committee meetings related to workshop organization and program evaluation in person and through technological means.
- (7) Cost of printing, distributing and/or mailing Lions Quest informational materials to create more awareness and an active support by educators and community organizations in District 2-E-2 and throughout the state of Texas.

Details of Matching Funds:

Matching funds have been contributed by16 Lions Clubs of District 2-E-2, Lions Club members, individuals at large, Forrest and Martha Johnson Family Foundation, Colleyville Lions Club Foundation and the Anchors For Life Foundation.

Steering Committee:

The District 2-E-2's Lions Quest Grant Steering Committee is composed of eight Lion leaders from the contributing Lions Clubs, one Forrest and Martha Johnson Foundation designee, AFLF designee, and upon a school district's adoption of Lions Quest a participant may be appointed by the superintendent to serve on the Steering Committee TEAM.

Evaluation Plan:

(1) We will conduct an evaluation of each school beginning with the 3rd grade by utilizing the Lions Pre/Post Assessments and/or other evaluation tools provided by Lions Quest. In addition, we will utilize the state required reports in a comparative study of the year prior to the adoption and the results following the first, and when possible the second year of full usage. A combination of data of being kept may include student attendance, disciplinary actions, academic progress, teacher attendance, and/or the number of community and parent volunteers. Qualitative data will be captured through student/teacher/parent conversations, school visits/observations, and/or antidotal data.
